PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- SMB Health and Safety meeting presentation
 - Spending most time on health and safety (implementing new protocols, etc.)
 - Given the COVID Start-up, there is little to no time for extra things (fundraising, special events, etc.)
 - Many teachers and staff feeling confident and ready to "meet the moment"
 - **REMINDER**:
 - Information comes directly from VSB H&S Manager, who gets their info from Public Health officer
 - Avoid gossip, heresay and rumours
 - Manage expectations
 - Health information of individuals is private, and won't be shared, or asked for
- Questions:
 - Bryan: Is the Purdy's fundraising still possible? A: Given that the order is online there's no reason not to
 - Shawn : Would it be possible for a video tour of what the school looks like? Hand washing and bathroom issues? A: Video tour(s) is in the works covering bathrooms, play spaces, hallways, etc.
 - Jenny: What communication and timing can we expect in the event of a positive case? A: A single incident or cluster of positive tests is beyond the role of the principal. Vancouver coastal health will be informed and shall take the lead in the event that this happens.
 - Ina: What kind of air circulation does the school have? A: Under normal circumstances windows should be open. This will be an ongoing practice. Each classroom has its own air vent. They are continually blowing air. Some rooms have ceiling vents. Given the smoke, the H&S department determined that the smoke is the most dangerous issue to consider, and thus, the windows and exterior doors are closed during times of heavy smoke from wildfires.

- Ina: Can the PAC/school/parents purchase mobile hand washing stations for the building? A: H&S has said that most classrooms have a sink and hand-sanitizer is provided in the rooms that don't. Because of this, this provides the same level of protection as hand washing stations.
- Ina: Is there any way that all the information can come from the same platform?
 A: John would like to collect questions and answer them via Principal Updates. If your question is not being addressed, feel free to call John.
- Elise: How is the limited washroom access/long lines working out? Have any issues come to light? A: John hasn't been made aware of any problems. It's something that will need to be addressed as issues arise. There is a H&S team that meets regularly to address these kind of issues.
- Ina: how can PAC/Parents help reduce the burden on teachers re. Supervision etc. A John asks that we be patient while teachers and supervisors develop protocols regarding equipment.

Treasurer's Report

- Vancity (Gaming) : \$2017.22 (Gaming grant still processing) balance due to unused funds from last year
- TD : \$36744.30 (-1.50 for a cheque image fee)
 - \$30000 is put aside to match the stewardship grant for the playground surfacing
- VSB cash online \$12843.60
- Will write a cheque for Artist in Residence \$2100 (VANCITY) and \$400 from (TD)
- This program is continuing this year, so this year's money will come from the gaming grant \$1050 (Vancity), to be voted on when we receive the grant.
